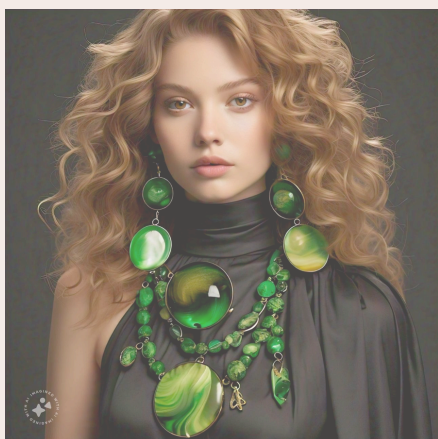




Mastering the Art of Accessorizing

- **Midi Length:** A dress that falls just above the knee to mid-calf offers the most versatility, as it can be dressed up or down with ease.





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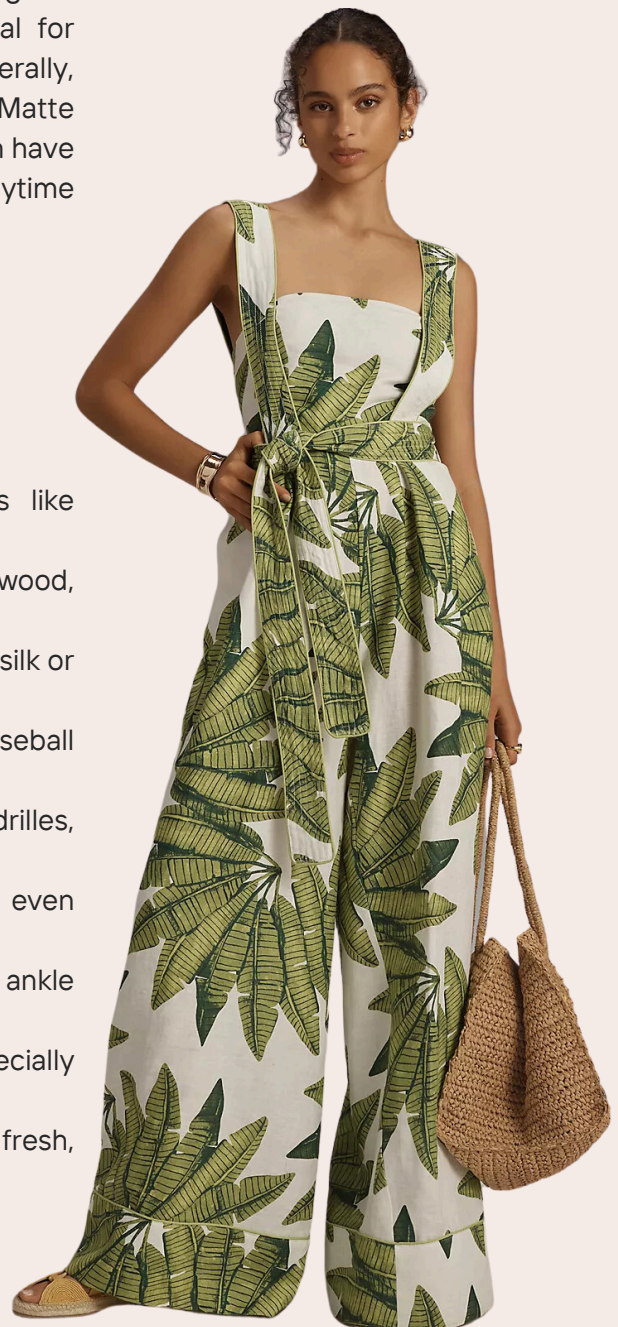
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The Timing of Accessories
